

#### HEART & SOUL



#### WORDS OF LIFE




On a hill overlooking the northwestern shore of the Sea of Galilee a large crowd gathered to catch a glimpse of a man from Nazareth proclaiming that the Kingdom of Heaven was near. The news of His message and miracles had spread like wildfire drawing people from all over the region to see and hear for themselves. One can imagine the hush that fell over the captivated audience as he made his way up the mountainside, sat down, and began to teach. The words of life and good news resounded with Divine authority as He declared:

#### REFLECT

With these words, He spoke to the heart and soul of desperate people and revealed the values of an upsidedown kingdom. A kingdom unlike this world. One where God meets us in our brokenness, loss and longing, and blesses us with His presence, healing and hope. Just like the crowd gathered on that hillside over 2000 years ago this profound good news speaks to our hearts and souls today. The words of Jesus are an invitation to move past the values of power, fame, and pleasure that our culture celebrates, and to receive the Father's abundant blessing.

DAY THREE





DAY FOUR




MATTHEW 5:3-11

Slowly read through Matthew 5:3-11. As you read, take some time to recognize the types of people whom Jesus says are blessed.


How is this different from what the world views as being blessed?

MATTHEW 5:3-11


#### IMAGINE



Slowly read through this week's passage in Matthew 5:3-11. As you read, allow yourself to be drawn into the scene on a hill overlooking the northwestern shore of the Sea of Galilee. Imagine the sights and sounds as a crowd has gathered around Jesus.

- \* What surprises you? What feelings arise as you hear Jesus speaking to the large crowd?
- \* Is there something new you notice?
