## Faith & Reason Group Discussion Questions – March 15, 2024 Is Al Making Humans Obsolete?

**Introductions:** go around the circle and introduce yourself, what brought you here, and how you interact with AI in your work and/or daily life – especially if you have relevant experience/expertise on contemporary AI use cases (**30 seconds, each**).

**Discussion prompt #1** (i.e., through **33:40**, 2 minutes, each)

- Production vs. identity, as it pertains to work
- Creation of new things vs. production / manufacturing of existing things
- Capitalism puzzle (i.e., exponential growth, cost "race to the bottom")
- Quality vs. quantity:
  - irreducible "aura" vs. reducible things
  - mind / body / soul vs. objects
  - personal vs. impersonal
  - "interiority" vs. external veracity
- Definition of life, humanity (theologically, scientifically, philosophically, personally)
  - E.g., robots, animals, chimeras, transhumans, primordial or created man, developing children, unconscious-yet-functioning bodies

Which points or themes do you relate to most? Which do you struggle with most?

**Discussion prompt #2** (2 minutes, each)

Imagine the hype of AI matriculates, and no function-specific human job remains (at least that any production-focused organization would hire a human for).
